Welcome to EYO!

The following are the basic facts you need to know about EYO, and just a few rules. We hope you will find them helpful. There are contact numbers for further information at the end of this document plus each new member will have his or her own “buddy”, usually from the same section of the orchestra, who should be able to answer most queries when we start in September.

Concerts

EYO prepares up to four programmes of music each year and gives concerts (excluding Tour) in November, Feb/March and June/July, an annual Concertothon in April, an EYO Young Soloists recital event in July and our annual EYO Roadshow outreach project to local schools at the end of the summer term.

The concert and rehearsal schedule (with information about finding each venue) will be available on the website from late August, but **please always check details nearer the time** as things sometimes change.

Concert tickets are normally priced at £12 adults, £8 concessions, £4 (students 11-25) and under 11 free and are available online at **eyo.ticketsource.co.uk** and on the door.

Communication

We need to communicate regularly with players to give information about rehearsals, concerts, social events and other matters. We usually do this by email (and occasionally by text). It is therefore very important that players have a current email address and check it regularly, especially in the day or two before rehearsals in case there are any special announcements. All emails are automatically copied to the main parent email as backup. Please therefore provide a separate email address for player and parent(s). If you give the same address for player and parent our mailing system is only able to create a single record and you are liable to miss important information.

Rehearsals

EYO normally rehearses at Twyford C of E High School, Twyford Crescent, off Uxbridge Road, Acton, W3 9PP, about 10 minutes walk from Ealing Common and Acton Town tube stations. Please see the EYO website for more details.

Rehearsals are on Fridays in term time from 5.45pm to 9pm, including a 15 minute break with a tuck shop run by parent volunteers.

Concert rehearsals take place on the **Thursday and Friday** prior to the concert, from 6pm to 9pm (unless otherwise informed), **plus the afternoon of the concert**, usually from 2.00pm to 5.30pm. These rehearsals usually take place at the concert venue and are an essential part of the concert process.

Commitment

Playing with EYO is great fun but is also a serious commitment to your fellow players, to our professional conductor and soloists and to our paying audiences. An orchestra relies on all of its members and the conductor needs to know the forces he/she is working with from the outset. Concert participation and allocation of solo parts are dependent on adequate attendance at rehearsals, particularly in the week or two before concerts, including additional Thursday and weekend rehearsals.

Please view the schedule for the term ahead (viewable on the website) and if you think you may not be able to make a concert, inform Leon or Chris as soon as you can. Non-attendance or late drop-outs can have serious consequences for everybody, including potentially having to hire professional replacement players, an expense which has a direct influence on player subscriptions.

Given the age range of the orchestra (13-19) a large proportion of players will always be in an exam year at any given time. Please give serious thought to whether you will be able to cope with the additional commitment of being an EYO member. Many people find it a welcome relaxation from the pressure of non-stop academic work and we are always sympathetic if you need to take the odd rehearsal off at particularly stressful times, but bear in mind that it's not something you can constantly dip in and out of: every session is a rehearsal for the next concert.

If you do have to miss a rehearsal/arrive late/leave early for any reason, please always inform Leon, Chris or Janey in advance by text or email. Contact details are at the end of the booklet.

Please arrive at 5.45 pm to help set up chairs, stands and other equipment for a 6pm prompt start. Always bring a pencil, preferably 3B, to mark up your music. Janey, or a duty parent, keeps a register of attendance each week.

If you cannot make a rehearsal for any reason and you have music in your possession, it is essential that you make arrangements for the music to be returned for the rehearsal. Failure to do so can affect other players' ability to rehearse and can lead to charges for replacement copies.

At the end of the rehearsal please put away your music and stand, and don't leave without helping to clear up and store everything away in the EYO cupboard. Chairs and stands are left out for Ealing Junior Music School on Saturday morning, but music and all other equipment need to be cleared away. Particular care needs to be taken to protect the floor and all instruments and stands must be lifted and not dragged across it.

Players' Committee

EYO has an active Players' Committee made up of the orchestra leader, nominated players from each section, plus the Music Director, Chair and Deputy Chair. It meets once a term plus occasional extra meetings when additional matters need to be discussed or organised. Please let Chris or any existing committee member know if you would be interested in becoming a member.

Half term, Christmas and Easter holidays

EYO uses the UK Standardised School Year as the basis for its rehearsal structure. While it is therefore inevitable that there will be some variation in weeks off between EYO and some schools, attendance is nevertheless expected at all of EYO's scheduled rehearsals. Please always check the EYO schedule (available on the website) before making other arrangements.

Music

Music is increasingly expensive to hire/purchase/replace.

Remember, if you cannot make a rehearsal, make sure your music still does!

Instrument Insurance

EYO has Employers' Liability and Public Liability insurance, which covers the players during all EYO activities in the UK and Europe.

While every care is taken, EYO cannot be responsible for loss or damage to players' instruments. We strongly recommend that all instruments are insured, preferably under a specialist policy (household policies may not cover expensive individual items like musical instruments, especially outside the home, but check first).

EYO is an official introducer for **Allianz Musical Insurance**, the leading specialist provider in this area, which means the orchestra earns a 10%

Concert Dress

Girls: black dress/skirt/top/trousers/shoes

Boys: black shirt, trousers, socks, shoes (plus optional black jacket)

No trainers or coloured items showing through please and bear in mind that we often perform in churches so it is not appropriate to wear very short or exposing garments.

Subscriptions

The annual subscription for 2018/19 is £285 or £95 per term. Parents will be asked to register a direct debit mandate as part of the enrolment process and payments will be collected on 1st October 2018, 1st February 2019 and 1st May 2019. The right is reserved to re-offer places where subscriptions are not received by these dates. To save on volunteer admin time cheque payments are no longer accepted.

The John Railton Memorial Bursary Fund

EYO is proud to offer a Bursary Fund named after our founder John Railton MBE and the separate Fiona Thomas Tour Bursary Fund, named after a former EYO parent, which may cover all or part of membership or tour costs in cases of financial need. Child Safeguarding

EYO adheres to the highest standards and has a comprehensive child safeguarding policy which is circulated as part of the enrolment process. The policy is regularly reviewed and is always available for view at our website.

Friends of Ealing Youth Orchestra

The Friends scheme costs £30 for families and £20 for individual membership. The money raised helps to cover concert costs and extra coaching. Friends of EYO are entitled to reserved seats at concerts and attendance at our annual party, usually after the summer concert. Many families continue their association with EYO after members have left.

Parental assistance

EYO is almost exclusively run by parent volunteers, and our only paid staff are the Music Director, sectional tutors and professional instrumental deputies for concerts. We have active Parent Support Teams lead by Team Leaders in areas such logistics, transport, publicity, rehearsal supervision, box office and other areas. We are always pleased to welcome new members and to draw

on the professional skills and expertise of new and existing parents. There are a variety of jobs which need to be covered, mostly quite small, in order to make things run smoothly, as well as larger more strategic roles, such as Box Office Manager, Auditions Co-ordinator and Transport Manager. As players move through the orchestra and eventually leave so do their parents, so new opportunities for involvement arise regularly. Please contact Chris Brown in person on Friday evenings or at chair@eyo.org.uk if you would like to contribute in any way – involvement in the running of the orchestra is immensely rewarding and Chris is always pleased to hear from people. In addition, **we ask that all parents commit to help at one concert per year.** Typical tasks include ushering, box office, stage management, equipment removal, refreshments serving and clearing up. Many hands make light work and we make sure we enjoy ourselves along the way!

Funding and Gift Aid

Our principal sources of funding are player subscriptions and concert ticket sales, so the more tickets we sell the better. Please do tell your family and friends about our concerts and encourage them to come along. Local publicity and word of mouth invitations do bring in audiences and the concerts are always exciting events. The trustees and management committee work hard to keep down costs and if you have any ideas for sponsorship or publicity, please do let Chris know at chair@eyo.org.uk - all suggestions are enthusiastically welcomed.

We encourage everyone to complete the Gift Aid details on the EYO enrolment form if at all possible. EYO is able to benefit from reclaiming tax paid on subs, and if collected on all payments, could earn as much as £2500 - a huge contribution to our funds.
